M: If you want to practise your maths you can use:



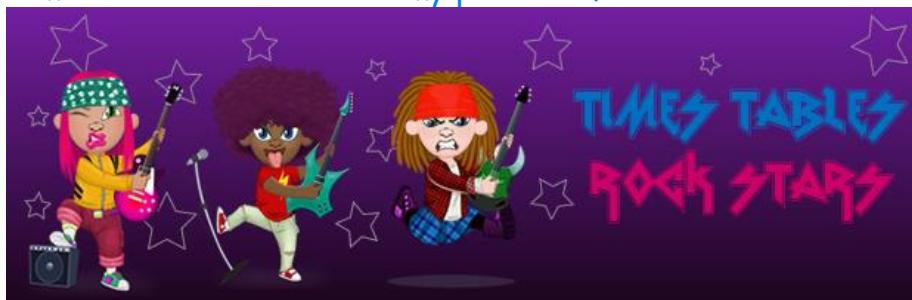
The vast majority of students (over 80%) come back to school in September knowing less than they did in July.

However, in one study* the reverse happened: 80% of children returned in September knowing *more*. These children had used DoodleMaths for 20+ minutes weekly.

Telling the time, weighing ingredients, measuring water in jugs - all important

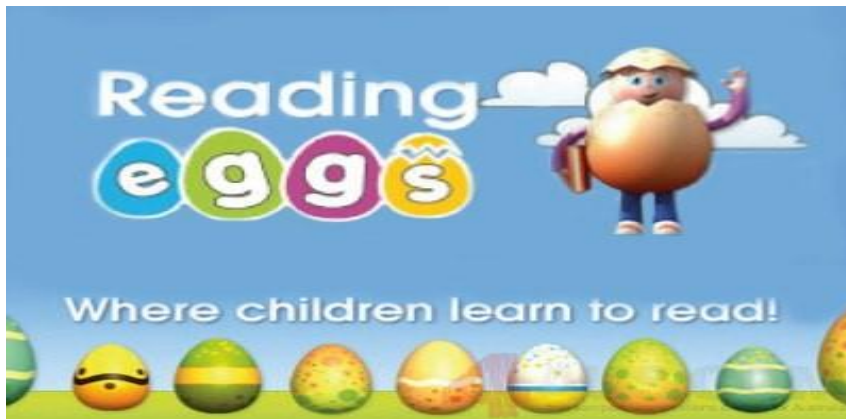


skills which are easy to have a go at. DB Primary Learning Library has some great games for Reception to Year 6 - counting to algebra!

Some of the Y5 'Big Thinkers' choose children who have thought about the weekly 'Big Question' which is sent out in The Grapevine for families to discuss. The philosophy style question helps improve skills in discussion, debate and empathy. The winner receives a prestigious badge!

Here are some more questions to think about and discuss with your family and friends:
