



Due to Covid-19 and children not being in school, we adapted the way we spent 19/20's money and supported children in different ways:

£700-carried forward to contribute to the cross-curricular orienteering course.

£2400 for new basketball posts for all children to be active when at play.

£700 for NW to run extra covid safe activities during the school holidays for key worker children (during lockdown)

£1500 for NW to run summer sports for all children during the school summer holidays (post lockdown)

£2500 for new equipment and storage so each bubble (class) could have their own individual kit for their playtime and lunchtimes.
